We are getting better at investigating places:


- Lake Ontario is one of the Great Lakes.
- There are 5 great lakes that border Canada and The USA
- The lakes are made from melted glaciers and began to form about 14,000 years ago.
- Toronto is the capital of the province of Ontario in Canada.
- Toronto is on Lake Ontario's Shoreline (North East).
- Ontario is one of Canada's 7 provinces.
- The border between America and Canada runs through Lake Ontario.
- Toronto is the largest city in Canada— 2.9 million people live in the main city, 6 million live in the Greater Toronto Area.
- Niagara Falls is one of Lake Ontario's major attractions— around 12 million people visit each year.
- The CN Tower in Toronto is the tallest free standing structure in the Western Hemisphere

Commuters: people who use public transport to get to work.


Multi-cultural: including people from many cultures.
