- Islam is a religion created by a man named Muhammad, who was born in Mecca in 570AD.
- The Caliph Al-Mansur built the city of Baghdad in 725AD as the new capital of the Islamic Empire.
- Merchants traded along a route that ran from east to west called the Silk Road.
- During the Golden Age Baghdad had a population of about I million, making it the largest city in the world.
- The House of Wisdom was built in the centre of Baghdad.
  Here Islamic scholars made many advances in science, medicine and art.
- Many inventions we still use today were created during the I Islamic Golden Age.
- While the Islamic Golden Age was prospering, Europe was experiencing the Dark ages.
- Baghdad was destroyed by the Mongols and never recovered.
- Without the knowledge from the House of Wisdom, the Renaissance wouldn't have started in Europe.

Al-Zahrawi was born in 936 and died in 1013. He was a court surgeon to the Caliph Al-Hakam. He has been described as the father of modern surgery.

#### **Al-Idrisi**



Al-Idrisi was born in 1099 and died in 1165 in Spain. He was a famous geographer, cartographer and Egyptologist.

#### Caliph Al-Mansur

Al-Mansur was born 714 and died 775. He reigned between 754 and 775. Baghdad was founded under his rule.
