





Survey conducted during February & March 2020


My child is happy at Jubilee.


My child feels safe at Jubilee and is well looked after.


My child makes good progress in their learning at Jubilee.


My child is well taught at Jubilee.


My child receives appropriate homework for their age.


Jubilee ensures pupils are well behaved.


Jubilee deals effectively with bullying.


Jubilee is well led and managed.


I receive valuable information from the school about my child's progress.


Jubilee responds well to any concerns I raise.



A representative selection of comments:

"My child comes home every day excited by something that they have learned. I think they go on fantastic class trips. The topics are engaging and diverse. I feel that his teacher understands my child's individual learning needs and personality. I like that he comes home with a new book that he gets to read for pleasure - not too challenging that he dreads reading to me at night. They work so hard in school, I'm glad there isn't a lot of homework. I do sometimes wish I had more individual feedback on him but I do understand that it is a class of 30 and there are limited times that I see the teacher (drop off and pick up is busy) but I know I can email them."

Common concerns

Healthy Food

There were several comments about the frequency of sweet puddings including cake and biscuits as served as part of the school dinner. We have taken this on board and will be monitoring the menus and continuing to work with the catering company to achieve an improved healthy offer for the children.

Bullying

There were some concerns from parents who had either experience of their child being involved in bullying or had spoken to friends sharing their concerns. We have dealt with very few bullying related issues this year, where we have worked closely with the parents and children to improve the behaviour. We acknowledge that we are always looking for ways to improve both the prevention of bullying and the processes that we follow to manage it. We are training all staff in the prevention of bullying as part of our ongoing staff training in the summer term and there will be a renewed focus next year.

Homework

As ever, the issue of homework is a divisive one. Although the majority of parents are satisfied with the homework set, some parents would like more homework, in various different forms, and some would like less or none. There were a few comments sharing unease about screen-based homework; however in light of school closures the potential of many online platforms used by the school are being realised. The school will continue to ensure there is a balance and homework is always accessible to all families.

Communication

There were a few comments requesting written feedback on a more frequent basis. In particular there were a few mentions of the difference in feedback from Reception to Year 1. We will be looking at our calendar of regular communications and feedback for next year.
