- London is a city with an urban type of settlement and land use.
- In London people get food from many places.
- The UK is split into separate countries.
- London is in the South East of the UK and surrounded by the counties: Kent, Surrey, Sussex, Essex, Hertfordshire, Berkshire, Buckinghamshire.
- Fruit and vegetables are grown on farms outside of London.
- Food travels to London from around the world.
- Refrigeration and fast transportation mean that foods can survive long journeys.
- Transport fuel is bad for the environment.
- Some food is produced in, or near to, Hackney.

N/E = Northeast


S/E = Southeast
