


Parent and Carer Survey

We had 115 responses over a three week period in May 2022. This was fewer than the previous year, where we received 219 responses.


My child is happy at Jubilee.


My child feels safe at Jubilee and is well looked after.


My child makes good progress in their learning at Jubilee.


My child is well taught at Jubilee.


My child receives appropriate homework for their age.








I receive valuable information from the school about my child's progress.



I really appreciate the effort that goes into each child, from the welcome at the school gate, to classroom attention and support, opportunities to try new things, and recognition of effort and success. I would like some more information in some of the homework that my child brings to do at home since sometimes I struggle not knowing what needs to be done.

More facetime with teachers is important to track progress, especially due to learning impacts from the pandemic. I have two children at jubilee (one who is over achieving and in year 6) and other who is in year 3 and more impacted from the pandemic due to formative years being disrupted and requires support- I find that with my latter child the school could provide more creative ideas to help support some of the learning challenges/ or additional targets or homework to be issued to support his learning milestones.

Jubilee is a great school, I will definitely recommend it to family and friends.

The only area where I disagree is in relation to how jubilee responds to concerns. The process for raising a concern could be improved. I was unable to raise a concern when I wanted to, and didn't really have a clear picture of who to contact going forward about the matter.

Great school and have had parents from my sons previous school ask about jubilee. Some have already started at jubilee say their children and are very happy.

Wonderful school and my Child is happy and learning.

Our daughter has been extremely happy at the school and overall we are delighted with our decision to join the Jubilee community. We have seen a huge difference in her happiness and confidence since changing school.

My kids always come home to tell me something exciting they've learned in school. They feel recognised for their accomplishments and also aware of where they could further develop. Learning seems creative. I'm happy to hear that they are reviewing the behaviour policy as my sense is that it feels focused on punitive response in a public way with kids missing playtime. I'm happy that teachers take behaviour seriously but just hope that's focused on supporting those kids who are struggling to regulate.

Adding not applicable would be useful as an option as e.g. I have not had to raise a concern or seen you deal with bullying so would not know how to answer. You did communicate your anti bullying policy though.

You have been through a terrible couple of years but it hasn't affected my daughter's love for and feelings of security at Jubilee. Well done Jubilee, keep it up!

Actions to take forward as a result of the survey:

• Some parents reported that they were unclear how to raise concerns and communications had been missed

Action: the school will ensure communication protocols are made clear to parents at the start of the new school year, and internal systems for handling parent communications are tightened up

- Some parents reported that they would like changes in the behaviour policy **Action:** the school has been conducting a review of behaviour policy and systems during the year, and some changes and staff CPD will be rolled out in Autumn term and communicated to parents
- Some parents reported they would like more help with homework and more challenge
 Action: homework expectations will be clear and consistent across the school, with suggestions in all areas of how pupils can be additionally challenged
