## Crucial Knowledge

- The United Kingdom is made up of England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland.
- The capital cities are London, Edinburgh, Belfast, Cardiff.
- The UK has a range of physical geography features, including mountains, forests and coastal areas
- Turkey is around 2000 miles from London.

I - It is split between the continents of Europe and Asia.

- Istanbul is split between Europe and Asia.

I - It is the most populated city in Europe with over 15 million people.

- Turkey has a range of spectacular physical features which are very different from London.
- Turkey is closer to the equator than the UK so has warmer temperatures.

United The place where we live, made up of 4 Kingdom: separate countries.

City: a place where many thousands of people live and work
Human A geographical feature made or shaped
feature: by people.

feature: and not made by people.
Lagoon: A stretch of saltwater that is separated from the sea
Mountain A series of mountains arranged range: connected in a line

Equator: An imaginary line around the earth, halfway between the north and south pole
