- The Alps are a mountain range in Europe and cover areas in the following 8 countries: Switzerland, France, Austria, Italy, Germany, Slovenia, Monaco and Liechtenstein
- Mount Blanc is the highest mountain in the Alps.
- The Alps are the third longest mountain range in Europe.
- The Alps were formed 34 23 million years ago when the African and European tectonic plates hit.
- There are other mountain ranges across other continents such as the Rockies, the Andes and the Himalayas.
- Farming and forestry are large parts of the mountain economies along with tourism.
- The UK and the Alps both have temperate climates.The Alps has more snowfall due to their high altitude.
- The average temperatures on the valley floor range between 5°C to 4°C in winter to 15°C to 24°C in summer.
- Different sports and holiday activities are popular in the Alps, depending on the season.


S/E = Southeast


