Crucial Knowledge

- Food enters the body through the mouth.
- Humans have four types of teeth incisors for cutting, canines for tearing, molars and premolars for grinding (chewing).
- Digestion starts when the teeth start to break the food down.
- Saliva is added and the tongue rolls the food into a ball.
- The food is swallowed and passes down the oesophagus to the stomach.
- In the stomach the food is broken down further by being churned around and other chemicals are added.
- The food passes into the small intestine.
- In the small intestine nutrients are removed from the food and leave the digestive system to be used elsewhere in the body.
- The rest of the food then passes into the large intestine.
- In the large intestine the water is removed for use elsewhere in the body.
- What is left is then stored in the rectum until it leaves the body through the anus when you go to the toilet.
- Living things can be classified as producers, predators
- and prey according to their place in the food chain.




producer: a plant that produces its own food
