Mission Statement

The PTA supports fundraising events and provides an impartial forum for sharing information about a variety of situations and events that impact our children at school.

PTA Strategy

Fundraising

The PTA raises money to support ongoing educational activities as well as one-off projects, supplemental educational materials and experiences. We do this through fundraising events - fun and profitable activities that support school and family social interaction in a safe and friendly environment. As a charity, it is eligible to apply for larger grants and subsidies through foundations, charities and corporations, worldwide.

Communications

The PTA supports communication between parents and carers and the school by holding regular meetings that are open to all members of the school community. The PTA helps by signposting its members to the correct person or group within the community, depending on the situation. To maintain impartiality, all PTA documentation and accounts are available to view online.

Voluntary involvement
